#### YEAR 1 NEWS

The Turtles children thoroughly enjoyed outdoor learning this week and expressed how excited they were to take part in next week's learning. Parrots class will have the same outdoor learning opportunity after half term. Grammar was the focus in English and the children learnt about nouns. They did a noun hunt in the classroom, played noun games on the laptop and ipad and thought about proper nouns. They also learnt the rule for plural nouns:

#### **Plural Noun Rules**

- ★ To make regular nouns plural, add -s to the end.
- ★ If the singular noun ends in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, or -z, add -es to the end to make it plural.
- In some cases, singular nouns ending in -s or -z, require that you double the -s or -z prior to adding the -es for pluralization.

In Maths the children have been learning to name and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. In History, the children researched the inventor of the Barbie doll; Ruth Handler. In Science the children explored materials and their properties.

**Home learning:** Can you read all of the alien (nonsense) words and all of the real words in the sheet sent home? Challenge: can you find the hidden alien word?
