Priority One – To ensure all groups of children are making at least good progress by adapting teaching to meet precisely the needs of pupils with different starting points (OFSTED 2018)	 Further training in support for children with SEND for all staff Autism level 2 training booked for all staff Assessment system further developed to ensure progress in accurate and to track foundation subjects more closely according to key skills Training for all staff in how to move children from their starting points Transition developed to take into account starting points of children even further, for example with Year One children having a more play based approach at the start of the year
Priority Two - To further develop the impact of Speech and Language intervention as removing a key barrier to learning	 NELI intervention trialled in EYFS and we have been accepted as part of the main intervention Continued training of key staff, for example in ELKLAN level 3 speech and language training Staff released to work alongside Speech and Language specialists Mrs Standen has achieved the Level 3 ELKLAN course
Priority Three - To further develop our curriculum so it fully reflects the culture, climate and values of our school.	 Curriculum re-vamped to include themes across Years One and Two Pupil Voice instrumental in planning the curriculum, for example in how the theme is celebrated and the questions the children would like to ask Galleries developed on our website so that parents are aware of the curriculum themes and key events The theme week of "One Hundred Years Ago" was a great success in terms of learning and the engagement of the children Mrs Winsley has been trained in Forest Schools and this is being rolled out across the school Displays across the school reflect the key themes, for example the foyer display We have really benefitted from the Big Sing choir sessions and are looking forward to our concert on 17th December. The sessions have involved all our KS1 children in singing. We are working with other schools in our cluster to provide further opportunities, for example with an animation workshop led by the Junior school
