Priority	Achieved December 2018
Priority One – To ensure all groups of children are making at least good progress by adapting teaching to meet precisely the needs of pupils with different starting points (OFSTED 2018)	<ul> <li>Further training in support for children with SEND for all staff</li> <li>Autism level 2 training booked for all staff</li> <li>Assessment system further developed to ensure progress in accurate and to track foundation subjects more closely according to key skills</li> <li>Training for all staff in how to move children from their starting points</li> <li>Transition developed to take into account starting points of children even further, for example with Year One children having a more play based approach at the start of the year</li> </ul>
Priority Two - To further develop the impact of Speech and Language intervention as removing a key barrier to learning	<ul> <li>NELI intervention trialled in EYFS and we have been accepted as part of the main intervention</li> <li>Continued training of key staff, for example in ELKLAN level 3 speech and language training</li> <li>Staff released to work alongside Speech and Language specialists</li> <li>Mrs Standen has achieved the Level 3 ELKLAN course</li> </ul>
Priority Three - To further develop our curriculum so it fully reflects the culture, climate and values of our school.	<ul> <li>Curriculum re-vamped to include themes across Years One and Two</li> <li>Pupil Voice instrumental in planning the curriculum, for example in how the theme is celebrated and the questions the children would like to ask</li> <li>Galleries developed on our website so that parents are aware of the curriculum themes and key events</li> <li>The theme week of "One Hundred Years Ago" was a great success in terms of learning and the engagement of the children</li> <li>Mrs Winsley has been trained in Forest Schools and this is being rolled out across the school</li> <li>Displays across the school reflect the key themes, for example the foyer display</li> <li>We have really benefitted from the Big Sing choir sessions and are looking forward to our concert on 17<sup>th</sup> December. The sessions have involved all our KS1 children in singing.</li> <li>We are working with other schools in our cluster to provide further opportunities, for example with an animation workshop led by the Junior school</li> </ul>
Priority Four: To continue our focus on mental health and well-being support for staff and children	<ul> <li>Amazing Me programme trialled in Year Two</li> <li>Hub working party set up and awaiting decisions from funding applications. Money raised elsewhere including ticket sales</li> <li>Well-being training continues for all staff</li> <li>Coaching training continues for key staff</li> </ul>
Priority Five: To further develop a love of reading across the whole school	<ul> <li>Reading opportunities developed at lunchtimes</li> <li>In conjunction with WISPA, reading areas being developed in the classroom</li> <li>Catch me reading awards and reader of the week are being introduced</li> <li>New reading intervention training is taking place</li> <li>We are working alongside other schools in the Chelmsford network who have this as an action to share ideas and successes</li> </ul>
