YEAR 2 NEWS

We have been learning about famous explorers. The children have a thirst for knowledge at the moment and have shown lots of interest in the lives of Robert Falcon Scott and Christopher Columbus. They also enjoyed a whole class guided reading lesson using the Bug Club book 'Painting Peril'. This is a Sarah Jane adventure and every child has had it added to their Bug Club collection so they can look at it by themselves at home. As we are updating our classroom book areas, we are having a focus on reading strategies and skills. We are encouraging the children to develop and improve their dictionary skills, including alphabetical order and using a range of strategies to read texts and answer questions.

Home learning: This week we would like the children to write an adventure story, either a Dolphin rescue story (Dolphins Class) or a Shark rescue story (Sharks Class) as we have a dolphin and a shark trapped in a net in our classrooms. The children can add their own illustrations and we hope to make a class book of all the stories. We wonder how the Shark or Dolphin will be rescued? **Mrs Hammond has asked the children to bring in an umbrella for next week's dance lesson on Wednesday.**

Spellings: was, wash, want, swan, wasp, squash

Challenge words: wander, wallet, quarrel, swallow

ISAAC for using chopsticks so well & showing a friend how to use them!



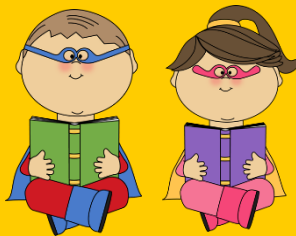

description of what they had drawn. After that they went on to plan a story featuring their character using the "boxing up method". In Maths the children recorded number bonds that make 20 by applying their knowledge of numbers that make 10. Their challenge was to record in a systematic way. They also continued to practise general addition and subtraction within 20. They solved word problems and used number lines, tens frames, Numicon and bead strings when doing this. As part of Safer Internet Day we recapped our SMART and think before you click rules. We read the stories of Digi Duck and Smartie the Penguin and discussed the scenarios that occurred. In DT they learnt about designers and designed their own toy for a pet.

Home learning: Please practise reciting the days of the week with your child. As a challenge, can you write the days of the week?

Spellings: day, way, say, pay, lay, away

Challenge words: sprayed, playing, birthday

FOUNDATION STAGE NEWS

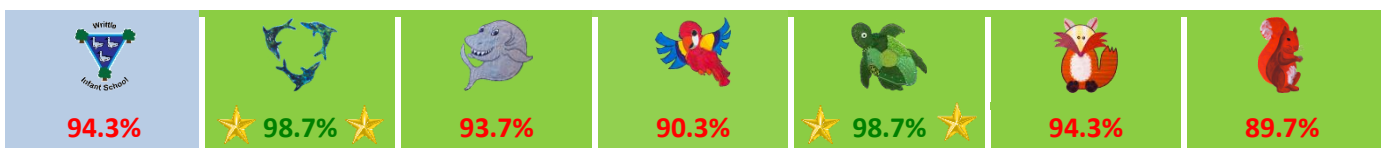
