Additionally, the questions generated by the bugs in each book really do help the children to show that they have a secure understanding of what they have read. They also focus on the key skills of prediction, inference, retrieval, vocabulary and sequencing. In Maths the children practised solving addition and subtraction problems which involved crossing the ten. They also explored fact families and making comparisons between number sentences using the greater than, less than and equal to signs. Guru Nanak and his importance to the Sikh religion was the focus of R.E. The children listened to stories and then drew pictures of Guru Nanak.
