


Mental health issues in the UK

- ▶ 1 in 4 people in the UK will experience a mental health issue in their lifetime
- At any time 1 in 6 people are suffering a mental health problem 10 million children
 adults in the UK
- Mental health is the single largest cause of disability in the UK, more so than cancer or cardiovascular disease
- ► The estimated cost of mental health problems in the UK is over £100bn annually
- The average wait for effective treatment for mental health problems is 10 years

Children's Mental Health



- ▶ 1 in 8 (12.8%) 5 to 19 year olds had at least one mental disorder when assessed in 2017
- > 75% of mental health problems are established by the age of 18
- 70% of children & adolescents who experience mental health problems have not had appropriate intervention at a sufficiently early age
- 75% of young people experiencing mental health problems are not receiving treatment

Forest Schools

- ► All children participate in Forest Schools, improving confidence, increasing activity levels and giving them regular outdoor experiences in a natural environment.
- Children have requested other outdoor activities, such as nature spotting or bike riding.









Amazing Me Programme

- SELFIE (Stop, Eyes, Listen, Feel, Inhale, Exhale) technique used both in school and at home. Our children have also taught this method to their siblings.
- ▶ 15 out of 31 children said that they use a journal at home to express their feelings in either drawings or written work.
- Children choose drawing and reading in our recently refurbished reading areas when they have free time in school.
- Ideas for the future include further yoga classes, mindfulness activities and peer massage.

Nurture Group


- Our weekly Nurture

How will the hub be used?




- Intervention groups nurture group, Lego therapy, musical communication



 depending on size, furnishing, delivery costs




