YEAR 1 NEWS

It was lovely to see the children back so refreshed after their half term holiday, ready for their last few weeks in Year One! They enjoyed telling their talk partner about their holiday and wrote recounts of what they did. In English this week we carried out a spelling assessment of the Year One common exception and high frequency words and completed a reading comprehension assessment. In Maths we practised partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones. The children used arrow cards and base 10 apparatus to physically make numbers. They also learnt about the importance of 0 as a placeholder in numbers such as 103 and 207. In Geography we discussed the differences between human and physical features of the environment. In R.E. the children learnt about Buddha and how Buddhists celebrate his life. They also discussed the festival of Wesak and made lanterns and coloured lotus flowers. Pollution and being good citizens was the focus of PSHE. The children were shown thought provoking images and were asked to discuss their thoughts and feelings.
