over the next few weeks. The children enjoyed their visit to the Juniors this week. They went



YEAR 1 NEWS

Year One have embraced the theme of Saving the World. They have been discussing how plastic pollution is affecting the whole world. They looked at a short video clip of Henderson Island in the South Pacific and were shocked to learn that it is one of the most polluted places in the world and has an estimated 38 million pieces of plastic polluting it. They were also



shown images of Southend beach after a bank holiday where people had left lots of rubbish. Again the children were shocked and decided they wanted to try and convince people that they should throw rubbish in the bin and recycle plastic. As a result they made their own newspaper articles and wrote persuasive letters. The children have also been working on the prefixes and suffixes: un, er and est. In Maths the children continued recognising and counting coins and also practised the days of the week and months of the year. They thought about dates that are important to them such as their birthday and also used a calendar.
