MESSAGE FROM MRS CASTELL

Another busy week here and preparations are in full swing for Christmas. Unbelievably we are only three weeks away from the KS1 performances. Today we have supported Children in Need and the children looked amazing in their spots and stripes. We raised £189.55. On Monday we were very proud of the children for observing the two minutes silence for Remembrance Day. Year Two observed their silence at the war memorial in the village. It was so pleasing to hear how members of the public praised our children for the



respect they showed. On Tuesday our Foxes and Squirrels children had an assembly from 3PR who support safer parking around schools. The rest of the school had their assembly last month.

A reminder that we love to share medals, certificates, trophies etc from the children's success away from school. Please bring them in on a Friday for assembly.

Please do check the diary pages on our website as this half term is the busiest of the school year and there are lots of events coming up. The first is on 26th November with our Christmas decoration morning and I remind you a Parentmail has gone out about this. Unfortunately we cannot exceed more than 15 extra adults in the classroom, given the room needed to make decorations!

I am particularly concerned about the number of holiday requests we are getting and in some cases being quite lengthy in terms of number of days. It is also important that children arrive at school on time. The doors open at 8.45 am and children are expected to be in their seats, ready to begin learning by 8.55am. If your child is 10 minutes late every day, they are missing nearly an hour of their learning a week.

We are delighted to say that you have given us over 1200 Aldi stickers, enough for 4 posters! This will give the school 4 free sports kits and 4 opportunities to win £20,000 for our Health & Happiness Hub. We have sent them off this week – please keep your fingers crossed for us! This week we have begun to tell the children the Christmas story! It's early but we want the children to know the story really well so that we can make up our own 'Helicopter Stories' about them. We will be using some of these stories in our Christmas concert! We will start learning songs next week too so you might begin to hear lots of Christmas songs at home. This week we have looked at the number 3, we have learnt how to write it and how 3 can be made, 2+1=3, 4-1=3 and so on. We realised it was an odd number and some of us even counted in threes!

Please do not put water bottles in bags as they have a habit of leaking all over the books. Please make sure that your child's clothing is labelled including shoes, gloves, hats and scarves. The children are doing so well with their sounds and learning to blend. It is so important for children to continue to practise this skill at home.
