MESSAGE FROM MS CASTELL

Welcome back and a belated Happy New Year! It was lovely to see the children refreshed and beaming after their nice long break. We look forward to working with you during this term, starting with welcoming our Foundation Stage parents for a coffee morning next Tuesday. The new vicar at All Saints Church, Reverend Tony, came to school on Wednesday to introduce himself to the children and we have exciting plans for the future.

If your child is in Year Two it is essential that you register for their Junior school place by next Wednesday 15th January. Unless you <u>make an application online to Essex School Admissions</u> your child will not be considered for a place, so please ensure you have done so! The same applies to any children due to start school in September – you absolutely must register by Wednesday.

This term we invite parents to join their children for a school lunch, from 11.45 to 12.15 for Foundation Stage and 12.05 to 12.35 for Years 1 and 2. We also begin our class assemblies this term (9.10 - 9.40am). Dates of these events are listed on the left. Following feedback we would also like to invite parents and carers to read with their children in school on Monday mornings from 8.55 until 9.15. This will start on Monday 20th January.

Would you like to help out in school? We welcome parents and grandparents in school to support the children's learning, for example by reading with the children. Do you have other skills or expertise that you would be willing to share with the children or to support the school? For example, do we have keen gardeners out there who would like to come and do some gardening with the children? Or do you have a creative talent that you could come and share with us? We know there are many hidden talents out there and the children at the school can only benefit from us all sharing our expertise. Please speak to me or the office if you are able to help. All regular helpers in school will need to complete appropriate safeguarding checks.

I would like to thank all parents who ensure that their children attend school regularly. Good attendance is essential if pupils are to make expected or better progress in school. Attendance is reviewed monthly and any pupils whose attendance is giving cause for concern will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer. It is also important that children arrive at school on time. The doors open at 8.45 am and children are expected to be in their classrooms ready for lessons by 8.55am. If your child is 10 minutes late every day, they are missing nearly an hour of their learning a week. I will be tracking persistent lateness very closely this term.
