## MESSAGE FROM MRS CASTELL

Well, that's January finished! This week we had a visit from our School Improvement Partner Craig Duncan, who looked at our teaching of Science in school. The new OFSTED guidelines focus on subjects such as Science, Geography and History so we are developing these foundation subjects further this academic year.

Thank you to Squirrels parents who joined us for lunch on Wednesday, we hope you enjoyed it! Next week we have Turtles class assembly on Tuesday and then Dolphins parents' lunch on Wednesday. We were hit by a sickness bug this week and we are very grateful to parents for giving their children 48 hours to recover before returning to school.

A few reminders this week: firstly please can <u>all</u> clothing be labelled with your child's name. We are finding armfuls of PE tops, for example, and without names it is impossible to know who owns what, which takes up valuable teaching time. We are also having an increasing number of children changing their dinner orders from what their parents have ordered for them. As this is causing some confusion, I will ask teachers to go with what the parent has ordered. If you do need to change your child's dinner order on the day, please contact the office before 9.30am.
