<u>Bug Club:</u> Remember to visit Bug club where you will find lots of books to read and questions to answer. There are also spelling, punctuation and grammar activities to try.

PE: Sock wars (Great starting point for netball/basketball)

Activity one: Attack vs defence

The defender tucks a sock into the waist band of their shorts or trousers. The attacker is aiming to grab the sock while the defender is trying to avoid that from happening. Before you begin, clear a safe playing space making sure it is free from obstructions, hazardous objects and sharp corners. When defending use quick changes of direction to dodge attacks. When attacking encourage children to keep their eye on the target and to use explosive lunging movements to grab the sock. When you are becoming more confident move on to Activity 2 (Click on the link below to see the game in action, including Activity 2 and 3)

Differentiation

Space - play in a smaller area, have a safe zone

Task -change the rules, e.g. you have to jump, hop, stride etc.


Equipment - play with a smaller sock,
