Girls

Black/dark grey joggers/leggings (winter) Royal/light blue check/striped dresses (summer) White polo shirts Royal blue sweatshirt/ jumper/ cardigan/ fleece Black, grey or white tights or socks

Boys

Black/dark grey **joggers** (winter) Grey shorts (summer) White polo shirts Royal blue sweatshirt/ jumper/ fleece Grey or black socks

Girls & Boys' Footwear - Black velcro trainers (no plimsolls)

Girls & Boys' PE kit (from Spring term onwards) Royal blue t-shirt Black shorts (joggers/leggings in winter)



Important reminders

- All clothing and footwear and belongings <u>must</u> be named!
- Children to wear clothes that they find easy to manage e.g. no shoelaces.
- Long hair tied back or plaited for safe play and to prevent the spread of head lice.
- Sensible haircuts e.g. no razor cut designs, mohicans, dyed hair.
- PE kit to be checked for size at the end of each half term.
- No nail polish, make-up or jewellery.
 - Children with pierced ears can wear small studs if required, please pierce ears at the start of the summer holidays to avoid missing PE.
 - Health and Safety regulations require that earrings are removed for PE either children remove their own, or do not wear earrings on PE days.
- Please do not send precious or valuable items to school. We cannot be held responsible for any items that are lost or accidentally damaged.

Snacks & drinking water

- It's extremely important that children have a drink and something to eat before school each day. If this has not been possible, please let us know.
- Morning snack A small portion of fresh/dried fruit or vegetables daily. Any other items brought to school will be sent home at the end of the day.
- Afternoon snack provided by the National Fruit and Vegetable Scheme.
- Drinking water Children should bring a named plastic bottle of still, plain water each day. This is in addition to the normal drink the children may bring into school for lunch times.



At lunchtime

- EYFS lunch: **11.45am 12.55pm**
- Children eat in the hall then play in EYFS garden, main playground later in the year.
- Free lunches daily, order in advance via ParentMail.
- Hot meal, veg option or jacket potato (no jacket on Wed).
- Packed lunches must be nutritious.
 - Drinks squash/fruit juice/milk/water.
 - Fizzy drinks/flasks/glass bottles not permitted.
 - Nuts/eggs/sweets not permitted.
- We must be informed of allergies/intolerances.
- Lunches for parents held later in the year.





Pupil Premium Funding

Children whose parents are in receipt of certain benefits (listed) may qualify for Pupil Premium funding.

Benefits:

- Free school meals from Year 3 onwards
- Support for after school clubs
- Free school trips
- If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2023.

- Income Support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (if you apply on or after 1st April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Safeguarding and welfare

Our first priority is to protect and secure the welfare of children in our care at all times.

- Please keep us informed of any changes in family circumstances, as it helps us to support your child in school.
- We have a statutory duty to report any significant safeguarding concerns.
- When we can, we will discuss safeguarding concerns with parents/carers before a referral is made. However, if we have concerns that this action could put a child at risk of harm then we would contact Social Care in the first instance who will advise.

Sickness & medical needs

- Please ensure your child knows the importance of regular hand washing.
- Please do not send your child to school if they are feeling unwell.
- Common illnesses are listed on our website, including necessary absence e.g.
 48 hours after last instance of sickness or diarrhoea.
- Any severe medical issues please arrange a telephone appointment with our SENCO before we break up, to ensure staff are fully briefed before your child starts school.
- A **medical care plan** is required for any medicines to be kept in school please discuss with our SENCO.
- **Prescription medication** may be administered on a short-term basis, only if this cannot be done by parents/carers. Two members of staff are required, unless there is an emergency. Medicine must be dropped off and collected daily by an adult.
- Please tell us about any medical condition that your child is currently experiencing (or has suffered from) so that we can respond to their needs in school.
- We may need to change a child's clothing/clean a child due to soiling. We always ensure there are 2 members of staff and that the child is in agreement with our actions. If the child refuses, we contact the parent/carer to attend to the child. Please inform us if you do not want school staff to change your child's clothing.


School attendance

"All schools should see the maximising of attendance rates as one of their key tasks." Department for Education

- Our school attendance target is **97%.**
- You must inform us **by 9.15am** if your child is absent.
- Schools are expected to consider a **home visit** if no reason for absence is given.
- Late arrivals after 9.15am may be recorded as unauthorised absence.
- Please ensure that your child is in school by **8.55am daily**. Doors open and learning begins at **8.45am** (8.40am from September 2023).
- In line with Essex County Council policy, **leave of absence will not be granted in term time**, unless there are reasons considered to be exceptional by the Headteacher, irrespective of the child's overall attendance.
- A pupil is defined by the Government as a 'persistent absentee' when they miss 10% or more schooling across the school year, for whatever reason. Absence at this level will cause considerable damage to any child's education.
