
#### FRIDAY 24TH OCTOBER 2025

This week we have been carrying on discussing where our homes are located and we have learnt about the countries that make up the UK. It would be lovely if the children could learn their address and come back after half term to tell us.

We have been learning about odds and evens in our Mastering Number lessons. We have also enjoyed using the visuals of 'Gary Greater' and 'Larry Less Than' (crocodiles) to compare two numbers.





Wow, what a half term it's been, we've had so much fun and achieved lots! This week in particular, we've been working on our fitness in our PE circuit training, whilst managing a healthy lifestyle in making biscuits in D&T, just like how they would have baked them in 1666! We've also finished off our learning in computing, by typing up all the key facts we know about the Great Fire of London and adding an image. In maths, we've been finishing up our work on subtraction as difference (comparing an amount in one set with an amount in another set) and in English we've been embracing the Autumnal weather with acrostic poems and Autumnal walks around the school. It's been a great week, with a well deserved break to follow, have a restful half term Year 2!
